To name and locate the world's seven continents and five oceans

To name, locate and identify characteristics of the four countries and capital cities of the United Kingdom and its surrounding seas

Place Knowledge

To understand geographical similarities and differences through studying the human and physical geography of a small area of the United Kingdom, and of a small area of a contrasting non-European country

Human Geography

To use basic geographic vocabulary to refer to key human features including city, town, village, factory, farm, house, office, port, harbour and shop

Geographical Skills and Fieldwork

To use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries as well as continents and oceans

To use simple compass directions and the locational and directional language to describe the location of features and routes on a map

To draw a simple map with a basic key of places showing landmarks

Physical Geography

To identify seasonal and daily weather patterns in the United Kingdom

To understand the location of hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the equator and the North and South Poles

To use geographical vocabulary to refer to physical features including beach, cliff, coast, forest, hill, mountain, sea, ocean, river, soil, valley, vegetation, season and weather
