## Locational Knowledge

Locate the world's countries, using maps

To identify the position and significance of latitude, longitude, Equator, Northern Hemisphere, Southern Hemisphere and the Tropics of Cancer and Capricorn.

## Physical Geography

To describe and understand key aspects of physical geography including mountains, volcanoes, earthquakes and the water cycle.

To use symbols to represent different physical features on a map

## Geographical Skills and Fieldwork

To find the same place on a globe and in an atlas

To label the same features on an aerial photograph as on a map

To plan a journey to a place in England

To use maps, atlases, globes, and digital/computer mapping to locate countries and describe features studied.

## Place Knowledge

To understand geographical similarities and differences through the study of human and physical geography of a region of the United Kingdom, and a region of a non-European country

To show awareness of the physical and human characteristics of a European region and a region in North and South America

## Human Geography

To describe and understand key aspects of human geography including types of settlement and land use, economic activity including trade links and the distribution of natural resources

To describe the main features and differences of a well-known city and village.

To explain why people may choose to live in a village rather than a city

Explain how a locality has changed over time with reference to human features
